Motion to Accept the Agenda

Approval of Minutes from the January 3rd, 2012 meetings

A motion was made by Trustee Matthews and second by Trustee Marinello. Upon the call of the roll, all were in favor.

Public Hearing: Proposed Local Law for the Regulation of Medical Transportation

Dennis Lynch, the Village Attorney, stated that he has reviewed and made corrections and adjustments to the Local Law and has provided a copy to the Board and the Village is now ready to hold the Public Hearing to get the public's feedback in regards to the Village adopting the Local Law and moving forward with the states mandate.

Public Hearing: Regulation of Towing and the Tow List in the Village of Monticello

The Village Attorney stated that the Board would like to regulate towing for the residents of the Village so that they are not being over taxed when their vehicles are towed outside of the Village and to other Municipalities. The Board has set a 3.75 mile radius which includes at least 7 companies that are on the current list, a new list will be formulated from those companies.

Public Hearing: Proposed Local Law Creating a One-Way Entry off Broadway to Sharoff Park Drive

As per the Village Attorney, Dennis Lynch, the Board of Trustees would like to make a oneway entry to Sharoff Park to the municipal parking on Broadway.

The Public Hearing was opened at 7:50pm by Mayor Jenkins and the Floor was offered to the Public:

Discussion: 258 Broadway Demolition Proceedings
