Trustee Banks stated that he feels that we are getting a good deal, even though Officer Dawson should be paid in full. He also stated that for the fact that Officer Dawson protects our Country and risks his life to keep us safe, for that alone, this should be a no brainer. With the legal fees that we are going to end up paying to fight this, we will come out just paying him the six grand and being done with it. This is why we can't keep good employees because we treat them like crap and do whatever we need to make the bad ones happy. This is crazy that this is even a debate. We don't even have a policy or anything in place so how can we deny this, there's nothing to base it on.

Mayor Nikolados stated that he agrees with Trustee Banks, there was word going around that the DA was involved and I spoke with her today and she informed me that she did not speak to anyone or give any advice.

Trustee Jenkins stated that he also served in the armed forces and understands the situation and thanked Officer Dawson, but said that he has to listen to the lawyer and go with the advice they are being given which is not to pay it.

Trustee Rue stated that she wants to make it clear that her vote is based upon the advice of the attorney which is not to pay. I asked Mr. Sussman to sit with the Village Manager and come up with a policy, so that in the future we have something to go by, but at this time, all we can do is go by the Mayor's advice and that is what my vote is based on.

Manager Report

Mr. Snowden stated that he would like to make the following appointments: Appointment of Stacey Walker as the Deputy Village Clerk effective August 1st, 2022 Appointment of Bonnie Carnell as the Deputy Village Treasurer effective August 1st, 2022 Appointment of Deshawn York to the Monticello Housing Authority to fill one of the holdover positions effective immediately

DeHoyos Park and Dillion Park is almost complete, again we are finishing the electrical work, we are having a hard time getting a hold of NYSEG, but Stacey has been diligent in staying on top of that. As far as Dillion Park is concerned, we are still looking for Lifeguards, I had a lead on two line up, but they declined the job. I've spoken to other municipalities and they are paying more than what we are offering and they still cannot get Lifeguards, so it's not just us.

Also, I spoke with the Attorney and he said that for the rental of the park, renters need to supply a \$1Million dollar insurance policy to cover if something happens, this way the liability is not on us and the individual that rented the park is responsible. I am making you all aware that will be added to our fee schedule and now be on our rental applications for the park.

Also, we need to increase the fees for renting the park and stuff. Everywhere else is getting \$400 and \$500 hundred dollars and all we are getting is \$50. That's not even enough to cover our overhead, if something breaks down, \$50.00 is not even a drop in the bucket. We must look at our fees and look to find a way to cover ourselves. This is another way that we are losing money and not recouping anything.

Concerning the brush pick-up, Jay and I continue to get calls about this brush. It's actually on us, we did not do it right and we did not notify the public first, so we need to either put it on

our quarterly water bills that brush will be picked up twice a year or something. It's not fair to them and we can't stop abruptly stop something that we have been doing all along without proper notification. Many of them are elderly and don't even have a way to remove the brush themselves, so we'll keep picking it up for now.

We also need to set a fee for those contactors that dump behind DeHoyos Park. If they are being paid to do the work by the homeowner, then the contractor can afford to pay to dump. All these fees will be paid through a permit give out by the Clerk, it can be a one-time fee for the year or a fee each time they dump, but we have got find a way to get a handle on all of this and start collecting money.

Everyone keeps coming to us because we are not charging for stuff like other municipalities do and we are the only one's losing. All of these "freebees" are part of the reason why we are in the financial shape that we are in, we don't charge for anything. All other municipalities charge whether you are a resident or not, yes less if you are a resident, but they still charge and this way when things get destroyed, there's money to cover it and right now as you all know, we are in a deficit. Any way we can get funds coming into this Village, we need to do it.
